

legal petition signed by at least 5% of the number of electors who voted in the last general Village election. All signatures must be signed by legally registered voters. All petitions must be filed 60 days before the State Primary.

SECTION 4 CANDIDATES NOMINATED BY PETITION

A candidate may be nominated by legal petition signed by at least 5% of the number of electors who voted in the last general Village election. All signatures must be by legally registered voters and the petition must be filed 60 days before the State Primary. The candidate nominated must file a statement in writing under oath that he will abide by the election, and if elected will qualify and serve as such officer. This must be done within five (5) days of the filing of the petition or the name of the candidate shall not be palced on the ballot.

SECTION 5 FILING FEES

Each candidate must file with the Village Clerk, and pay a filing fee of one percent of the annual salary such candidate will receive if elected. No certificates of nomination or certificates of election shall be issued to any candidate who is nominated or elected by write-in votes until the filing fee is paid.

SECTION 6 ELECTION NOTICE

Not less than ten (10) days nor more than twenty (20) days prior to any election, the Village Clerk shall prepare a notice to be published in a newspaper of general circulation. If there is no newspaper of general circulation, then the notice will be posted in three public places.

SECTION 7 ELECTOR QUALIFICATION

All qualified electors of the State of Nebraska who shall have lived in the State six consecutive months or more, and who shall have resided within the Village or school district for forty (40) days immediately preceeding any election shall be entitled to vote.

SECTION 8

ELECTION OFFICIALS

The Village Clerk shall, at least fifteen (15) days prior to the Village election, appoint three judges and two clerks of election in each precinct in the Village, to be known as a receiving board. In precincts where more than one hundred (100) votes were polled for Governor in the last presidential election, the Village Clerk shall, in the same manner, appoint two additional judges and two additional clerks to be known as the election counting board and count the ballots after the polls are closed, and make return thereof in the same manner provided as in the case of counting boards. The Village Clerk shall, at the time of appointing the three judges and two clerks on the receiving board, designate one of the appointees as a messenger, whose duty it shall be to receive from the Village Clerk the ballots, poll books, and other supplies necessary for holding the election in the precinct of which he is a judge or a clerk. At the time of appointing the counting board, the Village Clerk shall designate one of the appointees as a messenger to take charge and return the ballots, poll books, and other supplied to the Village Clerk as soon as possible after all the votes are counted. The ballots, poll books, and other supplies for the election shall be delivered by the messengers to the polling places in their respective precincts, at least one half hour before the time provided by law for opening the polls. No person shall be eligible to serve on any receiving or counting board who is a candidate for any office at such election. Each of such appointees shall (1) be of good character, approved integrity, well informed, able to read, write and speak the English language; (2) have resided in the precinct in which he is to serve for at least six months next preceeding his appointment; (3) be entitled to vote in the election precinct involved; and (4) hold office for a term of one year or until judges and clerks of election are appointed for the next Village election. The Village Clerk shall keep a written record of all such appointments, and which shall be considered part of the public records of his office.

SECTION 9

ELECTION OFFICIALS OATH

The Village Clerk shall administer the regular oath of office to each election official. The Village Clerk shall cause an entry to be made thereof and subscribed by him, and affixed to each poll book.

SECTION 14 DATE OF TAKING OFFICE

The newly elected Village Board and other elected officials shall take office as of the 1st Tuesday in June which shall be deemed the Village Organizational Meeting.

SECTION 15 REPEAL OF PRIOR ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT

All ordinances and parts of ordinances passed and approved prior to the passage and approval of this ordinance and in conflict therewith are hereby repealed.

SECTION 16 WHEN OPERATIVE

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, approval and publication.
